




Purpose: To comply with a DC Council mandate to publish:

GUN VIOLENCE PROBLEM ANALYSIS




Purpose: Identify the Key Drivers of Gun Violence

- Demographics and Criminal history of Victims and Suspects
- Motives for shootings
- Recommendations for reducing gun violence



Strategies to reduce violent crime



PREVENTION

- Youth Data and Intervention Initiative: Proactively identify high-risk youth and prioritize them for intensive services and supports.
- Community Resource Hubs: One-stop-shop for community services

INTERVENTION

- **Group Violence Reduction Strategy** (aka Focused Deterrence): (1) Identify high-risk individuals; (2) Direct and respectful communication; (3) Intensive services, supports, and opportunities; and (4) Focused enforcement
- Enhance Violence Interruption Efforts: Increase number; Assign Life Coaches to all high-risk individuals; Establish violence interruption academy

COMMUNITY TRANSFORMATION

- Blight Abatement: Vacant property enforcement and "cleaning and greening"
- Guaranteed Income Pilot: \$750 monthly stipend to households with less than \$50K annual income and children under 10 years old






