

THIS IS NOT ABOUT CRIME.

- DC crime is at historic lows.
- The Department of Justice reported a 30year low in violent crime for 2024.
- We've seen an additional 26% decline in violent crime in the District year-to-date.
- The city's official violent crime rate in 2024 was the second lowest that has been reported since 1966.
- This is about power and control, not about crime.

COURTS: U.S. PRES. CANNOT SEIZE CONTROL OF MPD

- The Trump administration tried to seize control of the Metropolitan Police Department through AG Pam Bondi's order to institute the head of the DEA as the head of MPD.
- Judge Reyes made clear that the Home Rule Charter does not allow the federal administration to seize control of MPD.
- As a result, Chief Smith remains Chief of MPD.



DC IS UNDER OCCUPATION

- There are three main arms of federal enforcement in the District currently:
 - National Guard
 - Federal Officers (FBI, DEA)
 - Immigration Enforcement (ICE)
- Local government has no line-of-sight into the assignments or activities of these forces
- District residents have no voting representation in Congress, meaning there is no direct line of accountability for residents to speak out against the activities of federal agents.

OUR NATIONAL GUARDSMEN ARE HEROES, NOT A TOOL FOR POLITICAL STUNTS.

- More than 2,000 National Guardsmen, largely from GOP-led states (WV, SC, OH, LA, MS, TN), are deployed across the District.
- This is expensive
 - Costing more than \$1M/day
- This is dangerous
 - National Guardsmen are not trained to patrol our streets and do not know our local laws, and they are now armed.
- This is unnecessary
 - Many are sitting around bored and unsupported, picking up trash that could be handled by local services, and having no direct role in achieving real, long-term solutions to real issues.

- The federal actions taken by the Trump administration are the consequence of DC not being a state.
- DC residents pay more federal taxes per capita than any of the 50 states.
 - And yet, we are most vulnerable to the kinds of federal overreach and intrusion we are experiencing now.
- To right this wrong, we must fight for DC statehood.





TIMELINE OF EVENTS

DC sues. AG Bondi revokes first order and issues new order that requests MPD services for immigration enforcement and clearing homeless encampments. We are under occupation, and many residents are fearful and experience daily disruptions. The federal government has issued myriad other threats, including taking the same steps in other cities across the U.S. and bringing back capital punishment in the District (which was abolished in 1981; last execution was in 1957).

House and Senate members introduce resolutions to terminate Trump's executive order. US Attorney Pirro announces that federal prosecutors will seek maximum charges against DC residents. President Trump issues new Executive Orders, including one seeking to reinstitute cash bail in the District, and another targeting DC housing, transportation, and increased federal enforcement.

This is when the 30-day time limit on the president's emergency authority expires under the Home Rule Act.




