Federal Impacts



Surge of federal officers

- "Emergency" has expired
- Federal agents, including the National Guard, remain in DC

SNAP benefits

- Due to federal government shutdown and federal administration refusal to issue payments, SNAP recipients are currently set to not receive their benefits starting Saturday (November 1)
- Happening at a time when we know food insecurity is on the rise (Capital Area Food Bank's 2025 Hunger Report)

LIHEAP, ERAP, and other assistance programs are extremely limited

• The result of lower funding levels, processing delays, and federal government actions that limit our local ability to provide assistance



Ward 5 Updates



2024 saw historic declines in crime, and we continue to build on that work with an additional 15% drop in violent crime YTD in 2025.

We know there is still more work to do.


